- 1320 Purcell proposes a side yard subdivision to build a new 2 storey, 3 bedroom flat-roofed house. Sits forward of the existing home to accommodate rear-yard parking. Heavy pruning of mature Horse Chestnut tree to accommodate building envelope.
- 1535/37 Despard goes to public hearing, no date yet.
- 1737 Rockland infill staff review stage
- 920 Richmond is demolished, with tree protection zones established.
- 1475 Fort St approved by council and proceeding
